Traditional conference of the Czech and Slovak Crystallographic Association is primarily devoted to the presentation of individual groups from the Czech and Slovak republics dealing with crystallography and structure analysis - short history, current situation and future prospective. Most of the important groups take part at this meeting in some form. In addition to main lectures, usual short contributions and commercial presentations are included in the programme and two parallel courses should help to practical knowledge of the participants: protein crystallography and XRD study of real structure of polycrystalline materials II - work with the programs MAUD by Luca Lutteroti and MStruct by Zdeněk Matěj. The issue is divided into several sections - main lectures (29), short contributions (17), commercial presentations and a text to the program MStruct. In total, 83 participants were registered to the date of the issue preparation. In the first day of the meeting, election of new scientific board of the CSCA will be closed and the new board should also elect new officers of the association. On the basis of this meeting and the papers we hope to prepare full text for an issue of the IUCr Newsletter.
